Summary Care Records – Briefing Sessions

For those of you keen to attend training on the Summary Care Records programme, we are pleased to let you know that dates and venues are now confirmed as set out below:

(Please note: the training sessions are predominantly aimed at independents as most AIMp/CCAs are organising their own internal training — with Asda being the only exception to this, as far as we are aware. However, the CSU is more than happy for multiples to attend their training sessions if you wish to — as long as your head office is happy for you to do so — you can email microalgaintenants to enquire about this).

The briefing sessions will commence at **6.30pm** with registration and light refreshments, with the presentations commencing at **7.15pm**. The briefing will be finished by **8.30pm** (approx).

There will be two presentations during the session:

- 1. What is SCR and how to use it
- 2. An overview of the role and responsibilities of the Privacy Officer.

Ideally before attending, all pharmacists and registered pharmacy technicians (employed or locum) within the pharmacy should complete the CPPE e-learning and assessment via the following link:

However completion of the CPPE e-learning is not a prerequisite in attending the SCR Briefing Sessions. The training can be completed at any point prior to being given SCR access.

At least one senior colleague from each pharmacy must attend one of the SCR Evening Briefing Sessions, who can then cascade the information throughout your Pharmacy. Places are limited and will be booked on a first come first served basis.

For info: there is a one-off drug tariff payment of £200 which will be paid to you once you have accessed your very first summary care record (available up until 31st March 2017).

PCSE Stationery/Drug Tariff Deliveries

We know some of you have been experiencing issues with deliveries via the new PCSE portal and as such, please see message from PSNC who are busy addressing these:

"Investigations have been carried out following PSNC's raising of concerns about late or missing supplies of EPS tokens (which also included a suggestion that stocks at PCSE had been exhausted). Investigations have also been made into late or non-delivery of Drug Tariffs.

PCSE has confirmed that there are enough stocks of EPS tokens, although some regional order variations resulted in a backlog. Stocks have been drawn from their distribution centres and pharmacies should be receiving these. The Department of Health has also confirmed that the maximum order quantities have been increased.

Drug Tariffs are delivered by CitySprint and deliveries of the April Drug Tariff were made by 4 April. Any pharmacy that has not received April's Drug Tariff should email PCSE.enquiries@nhs.net and PCSE will ensure delivery of this, and investigate the reasons for initial non-delivery".

IMPORTANT: If you have not yet registered for the new ordering service, we recommend you do so now – please do not wait until you have an urgent order to place because once registered, you have to wait around 48 hours for your password to be emailed to you before you are able to place an order. We have also been advised that if you have a query or are chasing up an order, you will get a much quicker response if you email (PCSE.enquiries@nhs.net) rather than telephone PCSE as this is their preferred method of dealing with queries and at the present time, is given priority. Waiting times for telephone calls to be answered are currently around 25 minutes.
