The Committee discussed the CCG's recent introduction of a new 'repeat ordering'policy whereby:  • communications with all stakeholders involved had not been simultaneous where they should have been  • this absence of simultaneous communication had reportedly led to some pharmacies losing patient nominations to DSPs  • CPNY had queried this with the CCG and subsequently demanded answers when the CCG confirmed a 'misunderstanding' had taken place around the timeline of communications  • DSPs were currently targeting the particular area involved with leaflets/letters so this may have been a contributing factor  The Committee were asked to make a decision on whether or not to
