NYC/CYC Smoking Cessation	Dan Atkinson (DA) and Phil Truby (PT) joined the meeting to update on the draft SLA for supply of Varenicline and Cytisinicline via PGD. The committee were happy with the proposed fees of £18 for the initial 12-minute consultation supply and £7 for subsequent supplies.			INFO

Visually Impaired Patients' Guidance	ID explained that discussions had taken place with Yorkshire Coast Sight Support as the Scarborough area has a higher than average number of visually impaired people and sometimes they experienced difficulties with their medications. CR commented that the onus is on the patient to let the pharmacist know they may need some adjustments making but to make this process easier, CPNY has devised a letter of introduction that the organisation can give to its members so they can give this to the pharmacist to help initiate a discussion. Costing Enhanced Services	A discussion took place with KT around the work done so far by CPNY and KT's team on the Palliative Care Service. It had previously been agreed that the hourly cost of a pharmacist (or other staff member's time) is not simply employment costs but includes other running costs. AC thanked KT and her team for engaging in the process.		INFO

Forum of LPC Chairs	SD reported that he and AC attended the event at the Houses of Parliament. There were 40 Chairs present and they discussed what typically happened at LPC committee meetings. It was apparent that there is a huge variation in structures etc. Overall, SD felt that CPNY's governance was good and the team fit for purpose. AC commented that one of the themes that stood out to him was that the committee must work in unity with no tension between different types of contractor.		INFO	
CPCF Training Needs	LS reported that there had been 22 respondents to the training needs survey. Overall, confidence seemed reasonably high around most services as 91% responded that they were 'very familiar' or 'somewhat familiar' with the new contract. Confidence high with Pharmacy First although more training in Acute Otitis Media requested. 77% 'very confident' with HTCF but 10% 'not very confident'. 18% 'not very confident' at Pharmacy Contraception Service, however 95% said they felt confident at the introduction of EHC. Confidence good with PQS and changes to NMS overall. 37% do not fully understand the bundling arrangements.		INFO

Strategic Plan and Workplan Update	LS commented that one update to the Workplan recently was that CR had worked with the ICB to send details of Pharmacy First to all schools ahead of the school summer holidays. Information was included in all school newsletters and CPNY awaits hearing feedback from this campaign. ID mentioned that CYC had reported being 5 weeks' behind on their sharps collections so he had set up a meeting to discuss how community pharmacy could potentially help with this.		INFO

Fed back to CPE.
